No Heat Checklist

If your heating system isn't working, remember: **don't panic.** If it's not working, it's not necessarily in need of repair or replacement. You could save time and money by identifying the actual problem and calling the correct person for help.

Here are five steps that might help you eliminate the need for a service call:

- 1. Check Your Thermostat: Confirm that it is set to the HEAT setting. Also confirm it has fresh batteries, if needed. To see if your furnace will start, set the thermostat several degrees higher than the current temperature and listen for it to come on.
- 2. Turn the Emergency Switch ON: Most homes have a furnace emergency ON/OFF switch that is usually located near the basement stairs or on the wall near the heater. Make sure this switch is in the ON position.
- 3. Check Your Electrical Fuses and Circuit Breakers: Make sure that no fuses are blown or that the circuit breaker for your heater is not tripped.
- 4. Reset Your Furnace: Turning the power to the furnace OFF for 30 seconds and then back ON will cause it to attempt to run through another heat cycle.
- 5. Check the Propane Tank Gauge:
 This gauge is located under
 the lid of your propane
 tank. If the gauge is reading
 empty or extremely low,
 you may need a propane
 delivery.

Call Us Immediately If You Smell Propane

Have you ever smelled propane, but thought it was no big deal? Have you ever had a friend or relative come to visit and they notice an odd odor that you have grown accustomed to at your home?

Propane in its natural state is an odorless, colorless gas. Since propane leaks can create a safety hazard, an odorant is added as the primary means of leak detection. The odor is often described as a rotten egg or sewer-like smell.

It is not normal to smell propane inside or outside your home. If you detect a smell of gas, even if it seems minor, or you suspect a gas leak for another reason, please call our office without delay. If we determine from the conversation that there may be a gas leak, we will come and inspect for leaks. Our priority is for your propane system to be safe.

Winter Safety Reminders

- 1. Always check your tank gauge before calling an HVAC company with a "no heat" phone call. If your tank gauge is below 10%, call us first.
- 2. Please keep your driveway and sidewalk clear of ice and snow. Our trucks need the full width of your driveway to reach your tank safely and efficiently. Please keep a clear path to your gas tank and the lid clear of snow and ice. This is especially helpful in deep snow.
- **3. Keep your underground tank marked** with the yellow flag or pole supplied by Penn Valley, a driveway reflector, or another type of marker at least 30 inches tall.
- 4. Appliances that discharge combustion air to the outside through vents or chimneys can only function properly with no restrictions. An area of four feet, extending in all directions from the vent, should be kept clear of snow and/or debris to prevent vent blockage.
- 5. When your propane generator runs, please watch the gauge on the propane tank and call us when it reaches 30%. Since we don't know when your generator runs, we need your help to make sure you have propane for all your propane appliances. To automate the notification process, contact our office to purchase a remote tank monitor that sends us the tank reading.

Renewable Propane


Renewable propane can be made from a variety of renewable materials like plant and vegetable oils, animal fats, and used cooking oil. Plus, the propane appliances you already have work on renewable propane. This means there are no switching costs to realize carbon emissions that are lower than conventional propane, which is already cleaner than most of the US electric grid!

While renewable propane has limited availability in our market, production is ramping up so we hope to offer more of it in the future. According to the World LP Gas Association, renewable propane could meet half the world's demand for propane by 2050!
